



Thought for the Month

My most memorable moment from Harvest last month came during the school Harvest service: I was collecting all the Harvest gifts to lay around the altar, when one little boy handed me his tin of chickpeas and said, with great warmth and sincerity, "Happy Birthday!" (To be clear, the school does a great job at drawing the children into the big moments of the church calendar, and it's pretty reasonable for one or two not to have quite got it!) I think I could legitimately have taken the chickpeas home, but I didn't.

With Christmas and New Year coming up, I'm excited once again for the chance to experience big festivals through the eyes of the children across our villages.



I remember the first time I took my son to Whipsnade Zoo: watching his reactions reminded me quite how wondrous tigers are. Getting philosophical for a moment, kids, like works of art, help us to break through the bored assumptions with which we view the world, to see beauty and particularity in a new way, as if for the first time. That's an important corrective to the functionalisation of society today, in which we're so focussed on what things do that we no longer see what things are. There is an over-confidence embedded in that perspective: we effectively assume we've ascertained everything worth ascertaining.

Jesus said that we can only ever come to God as a child (Matthew 18:3). He's talking about having the humility to recognise that we need God like a child needs a parent. But there's a bonus of that childlike humility: we see things afresh; we recover the experience of wonder, be that of tigers, Christmas, or Jesus himself. May that be what happens for each of us over this Christmas season.

Winter on the Allotments

On a bleak and wintry day a clump of rainbow chard lights up the allotment and once transferred to the kitchen it brightens a winter meal and tastes good too!

As one year ends and another begins our allotment work falls into two categories; there's the physical: clearing, tidying, protecting, cleaning and oiling tools, and then there's the cerebral: the quiet and cozy reflection, looking back on what worked and what was a disappointment, making plans for the next season, mulling over the colours, sounds, smells, tastes and downright glory of the season past.

Something I managed this season, which I always mean to but rarely achieve, was some succession sowing of spinach and carrots, prolonging the availability of two of my personal favourites, very satisfying.

It has been a fruitful year up at the plots, a great deal has been grown, eaten, shared, frozen and preserved, with allotmenteers more or less coping with the vagaries of climate change and seasons not behaving in a once traditional manner. There have been setbacks of course, a beautiful seeming tomato crop suddenly succumbing to blight, a sudden change in temperature taking out young seedlings, hungry mice feasting on early broad bean plants. But we remain stoical and positive!

And now something for a jaded palate, some inspirational recipes (name only!) from The Allotment Cookbook winter chapter...Balsamic roasted beetroot with Wensleydale, sour cream and chives. Two-tone cabbage stir-fry with prawns and ginger. Celeriac chips with venison cutlets. Curry with chickpeas and cauliflower. Leek, mushroom and bacon risotto. Chicken, leek and mushroom pie with spinach and carrots. Sprouts, apples and bacon. Spicy parsnip rosti with chilli sauce. Tasting even better when some of the ingredients are home grown!

However you celebrate this midwinter, I wish you joy with tasty vegetables washed down with a fine raspberry liqueur, sloe gin or elderflower cordial, while our compost heaps quietly prepare for the next growing season.





Matt Biggs of BBC Radio 4 fame was the speaker at our Autumn talk in the Jubilee Hall. His subject was 'Perfect Plants for Problem Places'. Matt is one of those amazing people who is able to speak unscripted and engagingly on his subject and we were totally enthralled. Before talking about specific plants, he explained the importance of studying the intrinsic characteristics of a particular 'problem place' including its aspect, drainage and soil type and ideas for addressing the problems, including of course the value of good garden compost for soil improvement. We gathered planting suggestions for hot, dry sunny spots, plants for dry shade, north facing walls, clay and chalk, all embellished with his own personal anecdotes.

Gardening suggestions for December

The days may be short and gloomy, but there's plenty to do outside!

- With the very mild weather we've been having so far, it's easy to forget about frosts. Keep a wary eye on the weather forecast and protect or bring indoors any tender plants still enjoying the fresh air before the temperature plummets.
- If you have pots outside still sitting on saucers, switch these for pot feet to lift it above ground level and avoid waterlogging.
- On mild, dry days, prune free-standing apple and pear trees, blackcurrants, gooseberries, redcurrants, and climbing roses. Avoid pruning stone fruits (like cherries and plums) until summer to prevent disease.



● Apply a thick layer of mulch (such as well-rotted manure or garden compost) around the base of plants and on bare soil to insulate roots, suppress weeds, and enrich the soil.

● If you're lucky enough to have this shrub in your garden or notice one around the village, do savour its wonderful fragrance throughout the winter! It's a Viburnum bodnantense 'Dawn'.

Jordans Village Hall Trust - Update 2025

As now with our existing Village Hall, all in both our villages will be so welcome to use and enjoy the amazing new facilities that will be on offer when the new hall is built.

A brief progress report

During the past year an extraordinary amount of work has been undertaken by the architect, the structural and service engineers and other specialist consultants.

The application for full planning permission has gone into Buckinghamshire Council, after approval from Jordans Village Ltd., and we hope this will soon be granted.

Fundraising

So, you may ask - How is the fundraising going?!

Our fund-raising target remains at £1.6m which is roughly made up of £1.1m for the construction of the building. This is high as our new hall will, as well as being a community space, provide excellent facilities for the acclaimed **Jordans Village Nursery School**. The remainder is for fees, fixtures and fittings and equipment as well as startup costs.

We have had some most generous pledges and donations from individuals and other Trusts as well as a fantastic year of community events which so many of you have supported and enjoyed. (Watch this space for the plans for 2026 !). At present our fundraising total is approximately £650,000.

Our next stage when Planning Permission is approved - a requirement for most funding bodies supporting community ventures - is to approach relevant organisations and submit multiple grant applications. We will also continue to reach out to you for pledges and donations. How grateful we, the Trustees, will be for your support.

And finally

We will be launching a **justgiving page** and a new website soon.

Our Living Village: Queen Elizabeth's "Court of Survey"

Following dissolution of the monasteries in 1541, Henry VIII exchanged Worksop Priory for the manor of Farnham Royal. He subsequently bequeathed "Farneham Ryall" (including the hamlet at Seer Green) and other landholdings in south-central Buckinghamshire, to the Princess Elizabeth.

As Queen, Elizabeth continued many of the reforms initiated by Henry. In so doing, a "Court of Survey" was held before her General Surveyor in 1561 with the jury tasked to understand the Farnham Royal land holdings, tenancies, rents, and local laws, customs and usages. The findings on the "Part of the Demesnes belonging to the Manor [of Farnham Royal] in the Circuit of the Seare" were confirmed "by the oaths of 12 good and lawful men" in 1562.

This document (a transcription of which is available at www.ourlivingvillage.org) includes a list of the demesnes lands within Seer Green, their names, acreage, agricultural use, and tenants; and where wooded, the growth of the wood, or the time since last coppicing.

The demesnes names in this document can largely be recognised, 200 years later, on the Godolphin estate map of 1753/1802 (see November 2025 magazine). The Godolphin map shows these to be bounded by hedges, which together with the woodland dates, is strongly suggestive that the medieval open-field system within Seer Green had been enclosed by the time of Elizabeth's survey. This is in common with other upland areas of the Chilterns, even though the relevant formal Enclosure Act was not initiated by Parliament until the 19th century (we will examine this in a future article).

Look carefully, particularly along hedge-lines, footpaths and in woodland (especially Hodgemoor Woods) and you can still see the evidence for the ridge and furrow ploughing from the pre-enclosure open-field system.



True, shocking, and bizarre was how ex-Metropolitan Police Officer Paul Barwick described the 15 year-old mystery of the death of Gareth Williams. Deceit and intrigue suggest the truth of the unpleasant incident may never be revealed. Was the death an accident, suicide, or murder?

Gareth was an exceptionally gifted child; a whizz on computers aged 5, and his PhD awarded aged 18. As an online computer gamer he was virtually unbeatable, and given his outstanding talent, it's no surprise that he was recruited by MI6.

His first posting was to Government Communications Headquarters (GCHQ) where with his strong maths background he was recognized as an expert codebreaker. He had a small circle of close friends and Holyhead Cycling Club. It appears that GCHQ was his perfect workplace, but in 2009 Gareth undertook a 12-month rolling attachment within MI6 at Vauxhall Cross. He lived in a flat in Pimlico, close to his office.

Gareth's death was unpleasant; his remains were found in a locked holdall in his bath. Decomposition was extreme, brought on by the intense heat blasting out from the central heating system in mid- August 2010. There were no obvious signs of any resistance. His computer and mobile were set to factory settings and the flat was immaculate. It had been forensically cleansed before the police arrived, and the front door was locked from the outside. Was this death by asphyxiation, or death by an untraceable poison? Was this self-inflicted, or were there other hands at work? Did Gareth's death have something to do with a secret private life or was it work-related? A double - agent has alleged that there had been an attempt at blackmail, and there was rumour that Gareth was aware of a GCHQ mole. What remains is a mystery.




Village Voices sing in Trafalgar Square



This follow up book is the most beautiful, life affirming, positive and heartwarming gift that anybody, young or old could receive.

How to make a Christmas Tree Decoration

You need:

A variety of size and colours of buttons (some red, green, gold, silver and white work well). They need 2 or 4 holes and should be fairly flat. You can buy bags of buttons from Hobby craft, the internet or source in charity shops. Recycled and reusing is ideal.

Embroidery threads. Red, green, blue, purple – depends on your buttons and what you can source

A bag of gold or silver star beads. I found some in Hobbycraft.




To construct:-

1. Measure a length of embroidery thread about 50 to 60cm.
2. Choose a variety of sized and coloured buttons. About 16 to 20.
3. Choose 3 small buttons for the tree trunk. Put these to one side.
4. Now put the rest of the buttons in size order.
5. Thread the embroidery thread you have chosen and starting at the top of the tree, thread all of the buttons onto the thread, ending with the 3 smaller ones for the tree trunk.
6. Now come back up through all of the buttons using the second hole or the opposite hole where there are four.
7. Now thread on the star putting both threads through the hole. This is better done one at a time.
8. Check that the thread is the same length on both sides and tie a knot as close to the star bead as possible. Then tie the ends of the thread together.

Christmas Compote and Granola

Breakfast can be tricky with all the other cooking over the Christmas period. This is a simple idea for a quick start to the festive days which can be made in advance.

Compote Ingredients

1kg frozen mixed fruit, 75g caster sugar, 2 cinnamon sticks, pared peel of 1 orange. Also, an optional dash of Amaretto (or other liquor of choice).

Method

Dip the frozen fruits into a large saucepan and place on a low heat, add the sugar, cinnamon sticks, and orange peel strips. Gently simmer until the fruits have defrosted and the sugar has dissolved, simmer very gently for a further 5 minutes.

Take off the heat and leave to cool in the pan over night. Remove the cinnamon sticks and orange peel, then stir in the Amaretto if using. Store in a sealed container in the fridge for up to 5 days.



Granola Ingredients

300g oats, 45ml (3 Tbsp) sunflower oil, 60ml (4 Tbsp) runny honey or maple syrup. 5ml (1 tsp) vanilla essence, 5ml (1 tsp) ground cinnamon, 100g chopped nuts of your choice, 100g mixed seeds, 100g dried fruits of your choice.

Method

Heat oven to 170c Fan. In a large bowl mix together the oats, oil, cinnamon, and vanilla. Place this oat mixture on to a large baking tray and spread out. Bake for 20 minutes, stir in the nuts and seeds, and return to the oven for a further 10 minutes. Remove from the oven and stir in the dried fruit and allow to cool. Store in an airtight container for up to one month.


